HOW



Canstruction is an event in which a structure of an organizations choosing is built using canned or packaged food items. Once completed, the cans are donated to the food bank for distribution to those in need.

The judging categories include: Best Meal, Best Use of Labels, Structural Ingenuity, Jurors' Favorite, Honorable Mention, People's Choice and Most Food Used. Once your Canstruction project is built, judges will visit your location to judge your sculpture. Please join this fun, creative, and friendly Canstruction competition.

A few friendly reminders: Teams are responsible for their own cans (please no damaged goods). should be easily removable (no tape, please) and **structures should be ready to be judged the week of September 26, 2016** at your location!
