Belanger named Young Engineer of the Year

TEREMY BELANGER, P.E., has been selected as the 2020 New Hampshire Young Engineer of the Year. The American Society of Civil Engineers - New Hampshire Section (ASCE-NH) submitted his nomination not only for his involvement in ASCE-NH, but for his outstanding work ethic, his integrity as a young professional, his dedication and enthusiasm for the civil engineering profession, and his volunteerism in giving back to the community.

Belanger started his engineering career with the family business working for his father, Jacques Belanger, LLS as part of a survey field crew before working as a summer intern and part-time employee with Gomez and Sullivan while obtaining his B.S. in Civil Engineering from the University of New Hampshire (UNH).

Upon his graduation in 2010, he obtained his M.S. in Civil Engineering/Water Resources from UNH and continued his career with Gomez and Sullivan as a Water Resources Engineer conducting bathymetric surveys and habitat restoration projects, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Studies (FIS), Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) relicensing studies, hydroelectric generation analysis, hydraulic dam break analysis and inundation mapping, and dam removal feasibility and design.

The desire to be closer to his family and familiar surroundings brought Belanger back to New Hampshire in 2015 when he accepted a position as a civil project engineer with TFMoran, Inc. In his nearly five years with TFMoran, Belanger has made himself indispensable with his tireless work ethic, professionalism and enthusiasm for each assignment.

Belanger's efforts have not gone unnoticed, as he was recently promoted to Senior Project Engineer, making him the voungest to achieve such a title in TFMoran's 50-plus years of operation. At TFMoran he is responsible for the engineering design and permitting of land development projects and has experience in site planning, drainage design, sewer design, and local and state permitting for residential, commercial, industrial, municipal and energy projects.

Belanger is an active member of the community and gives back in many ways. After moving back to New Hampshire, he began volunteering for **UpReach Thera**peutic Equestrian Center. UpReach
